

## Getting Started with Libby

With Libby, you can borrow free ebooks, digital audiobooks, and magazines from your library. All you need is a library card.

### Step 1

Install the Libby app from your device's app store.

Or, visit [libbyapp.com](http://libbyapp.com) in your Chrome, Safari, Firefox, or Edge browser.

### Step 2

In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a library card.

### Step 3

Browse your library's catalog and borrow a title.

Your selection will vary based on your library, since each library chooses what titles and formats to offer in Libby.

### Step 4

Borrowed titles appear on your Shelf ( ) and download to the app automatically when you're connected to Wi-Fi, so you can read them when you're offline.

On your Shelf, tap loans at the top of the screen. From there, you can:

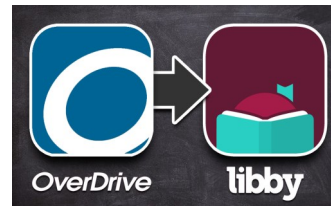
Tap Read With... to choose where you'd like to read the book (Kindle or Libby), then

finish sending to Kindle (U.S. libraries only) or start reading in Libby.

Tap Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.

Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.

Are you tired of what is on TV right now? Are there ebooks you are looking for on Overdrive but can't find them? Why not try the library's other streaming service, Hoopla?

Hoopla is a groundbreaking digital media service offered by your local public library that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone – and even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately, or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later. We have hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from, with more being added daily. Hoopla is like having your public library at your fingertips. Anytime. Anywhere.

The benefits of hoopla digital include:

- Every item in the collection can be viewed, read or listened to through a single app or the hoopla website.
- Every item is instantly available, so you never have to wait for an item to be checked back into the library to borrow it.

You can download the free Hoopla app from the Apple App Store and Google Play store. It's available for iPhones, iPad, Android phones and tablets as well as AppleTV, AndroidTV, Roku, and FireTV.

Hoopla has over 800,000 title with movies from studios such as Disney, Miramax, and A24 and TV shows from AcornTV, BBC, and TNT.

### How long can I borrow items from hoopla?

Movies & television shows - Three (3) days

Music albums - Seven (7) days

eBooks, digital audiobooks and comics - 21 days

### How many items can I check out from hoopla?

Check out ten items every month, with a new ten item limit available at the start of each calendar month.

You will need the 14-digit number found on the back of your Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library card and your PIN to use hoopla digital. Your PIN will be your last name in lower case letters.

Tonight, why not go online and look around to see if you can find an old favorite or a brand new title for check out?

Need help using your new Kindle? Want to create a Facebook profile but don't know where to get started? Did you get a new smartphone and just can't get the hang of it? The library staff can help you with all of that and so much more!



The Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library offers FREE One-on-One Tech Help by appointment. So when you have more than a quick question about technology, try booking up to a 30 minute appointment for one-on-one technology help! To make an appointment for a one-on-one technology assistance session, call the library staff at (409) 722-1255. Please note that you may only book ONE appointment at a time.

Examples of what you can learn how to use:

- Kindle eReaders
- Setting up your devices to use Overdrive
- Microsoft Office Basics
- Setting up a Gmail and a Google Drive account
- Social Media such as Facebook, Twitter, etc.
- Smartphone Basics
- Downloading apps to your devices (smartphones, tablets, laptops, etc.)

You'll need to have some information to get started and there are some limits on the help we can provide.

- One-on-One appointments are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.
- Please arrive with a clear goal of what you would like to learn and any de-

vice you need help with

- Please note that the library staff may not be able to provide detailed assistance for all products such as non-standard software.
- Library staff can't suggest what type of software you might need for a particular issue or project you are trying to tackle if they have not already used that specific type of program before.

## Tumble Book Library

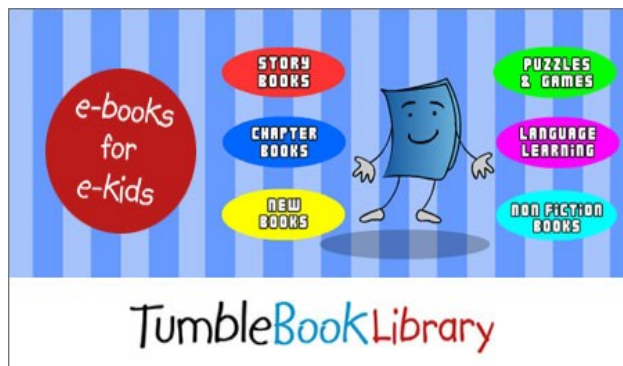
This is the end of the school year but your child still needs AR points. Did you know that the library has digital books that you and your child can access at any time? Why not look into TumbleBooks?

TumbleBooks are **animated, talking picture books** which teach kids the joy of reading in a format they'll love. TumbleBooks are created by taking existing picture books, adding animation, sound, music and narration to produce an electronic picture book which you can read, or have read to you.

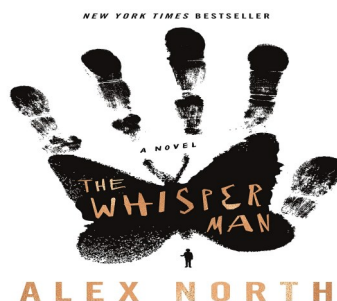
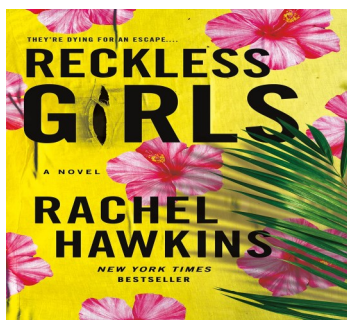
