Are you tired of what is on TV right now? Are there ebooks you are looking for on Overdrive but can't find them? Why not try the library's newest streaming service, Hoopla?

Hoopla is a groundbreaking digital media service offered by your local public library that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone – and even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately, or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later. We have hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from, with more being added daily. Hoopla is like having your public library at your fingertips. Anytime. Anywhere.

The benefits of hoopla digital

include:

- Every item in the collection can be viewed, read or listened to through a single app or the hoopla website.
- Every item is instantly available, so you never have to wait for an item to be checked back into the library to borrow it.

You can download the free Hoopla app from the Apple App Store and Google Play store. It's available for iPhones, iPad, Android phones and tablets as well as AppleTV, AndroidTV, Roku, and FireTV.

Hoopla has over 800,000 title with movies from studios such as Disney, Miramax, and A24 and TV shows from AcornTV, BBC, and TNT.

How long can I borrow items from hoopla?

Movies & television shows -Three (3) days

Music albums - Seven (7) days

eBooks, digital audiobooks

and comics - 21 days How many items can I check out from hoopla?

Check out five items every month, with a new five item limit available at the start of each calendar month.

You will need the 14-digit number found on the back of your Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library card and your PIN to use hoopla digital. Your PIN will be your last name in lower case letters.

Tonight, why not go online and look around to see if you can find an old favorite or a brand new title for check out?

So when you have more than a quick question about technology, try booking up to a 30 minute appointment for one-on-one technology help! To make an appointment for a one-on-one technology assistance session, call the library staff at (409) 722-1255. Please note that you may only

1255. Please note that you may only book ONE appointment at a time.

Examples of what you can learn how to use:

- Kindle eReaders
- Setting up your devices to use Overdrive
- Microsoft Office Basics
- Setting up a Gmail and a Google Drive account
- Social Media such as Facebook, Twitter, etc.
- Smartphone Basics
- Downloading apps to your devices (smartphones, tablets, laptops, etc.)

You'll need to have some information to get started and there are some limits on the help we can provide.

- One-on-One appointments are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.
- Please arrive with a clear goal of what you would like to learn and any de-

vice you need help with

- Please note that the library staff may not be able to provide detailed assistance for all products such as nonstandard software.
- Library staff can't suggest what type of software you might need for a particular issue or project you are trying to tackle if they have not already used that specific type of program before.
- Library staff cannot give advice on medical, legal or tax issues nor will they

be able to write, edit, or complete any documents for any individuals.

- 2. Due to tax law changes, the IRS provides online assistance at www.irs.gov.

BrainFuse Help Now

The first day back to school after the long winter break is January 5th. Does your student need help understanding their homework? Why not let the library's newest online service help?

Brainfuse is a homework help website where students and tutors can meet in the Brainfuse Online Classroom. There tutors guide students through homework challenges and help them develop the necessary skills to complete assignments on their own. But that is just the beginning of what Brainfuse has to offer students and adults.

Brainfuse offers live skills tutoring and an extensive library of Brainfuse-created lessons and videos tutorials that can be accessed when the tutors are offline or if the student just needs a little more information on the subject. There are games and quizzes that the student could customize by just uploading the list of words or material needed to be studied and then "play" their way into remembering it all. In addition, SkillSurfer contains hundreds of practice tests in a wide range of subjects. Along with the normal subjects, SkillSurfer offers practice test for tests such as:

- The new SAT
- ACT
- The new GED
- TASC (a GED alternative test)
- HiSet (a GED alternative test)
- GRE
- GMAT
- ASVAB
- TOEFL
- TOEIC
- US Citizenship Test Course: (including practice tests and lessons)
- College Placement Test Preparation: (COMPASS/ACCUPLACER)

Once the practice test is taken, the student can see what areas of the test they need help on and either use the online lessons and videos or access a tutor for more help.

Brainfuse also has a Writing Lab where a student can upload a paper they are writing to have the tutors look over it and give them suggestions about areas of their paper, including voice, fluency, organization, and word choice.
