July 1

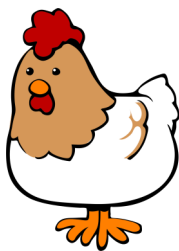
Moose Day

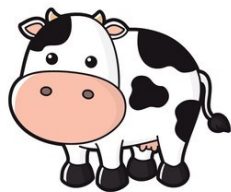
July 8 Lions, Tigers, & Bears OH MY!

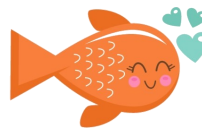
Piggies

Hoopla

Are you tired of what is on TV right now? Are there ebooks you are looking for on Overdrive but can't find them? Why not try the library's newest streaming service, Hoopla?

Hoopla is a groundbreaking digital media service offered by your local public library that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy

on your computer, tablet, or phone – and even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately, or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later. We have hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from, with more being added daily. Hoopla is like having your public library at your fingertips. Anytime. Anywhere.

The benefits of Hoopla digital include:

- Every item in the collection can be viewed, read or listened to through a single app or the Hoopla website.
- Every item is instantly available, so you never have to wait for an item to be checked back into the library to borrow it.

You can download the free Hoopla app from the Apple App Store and Google Play store. It's available for iPhones, iPad, Android phones and tablets as well as AppleTV, AndroidTV, Roku, and FireTV.

Hoopla has over 800,000 titles with movies from studios such as Disney, Miramax, and A24 and TV shows from AcornTV, BBC, and TNT.

How long can I borrow items from Hoopla?

Movies & television shows - Three (3) days

Music albums - Seven (7) days

eBooks, digital audiobooks and comics - 21 days

How many items can I check out from Hoopla?

Check out ten items every month, with a new ten item limit available at the start of each calendar month.

You will need the 14-digit number found on the back of your Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library card and your PIN to use Hoopla digital. Your PIN will be your last name in lower case letters.

Tonight, why not go online and look around to see if you can find an old favorite or a brand new title for check out?

Have you already seen everything the local channels are offering you? Are you looking for something else to watch while you're on the go? Have you heard of the free streaming app Tubi?

Tubi is 100% legal unlimited streaming, with no credit cards and no subscription required. Choose what

you want to watch, when you want to watch it, with fewer ads than regular TV. Tubi is the largest free streaming service featuring award-winning movies and TV series. There is



something for everybody; from comedy to drama, kids to classics, and niche favorites such as Korean dramas, anime, and British series.

Tubi adds free HD shows and movies every week, so you'll never run out of entertainment to stream on the go

(and at home!). Their goal is to offer as many categories of TV shows and movies as they can so you don't have watch the same old thing over and over again. Not only are their movies and online TV shows always free and available anywhere but they're also highly rated on IMDb and Rotten Tomatoes. All of their categories are free to choose from, including New Releases, and Anime TV series



that you can't find on other popular subscription video apps. Their Anime collection has Naruto, Yu-gi-oh, Cowboy Bebop, and much more.

While Tubi doesn't have original programming or live events that other

streaming services may have, it does allow for people to stream a variety of movies and TV shows that they wouldn't be able to find on other streaming sites. It's easy to start watching. Once you have the app downloaded, you can sign up for a free account and start watching right away. This is just another option to keep you entertained in this "New Normal" we have now.



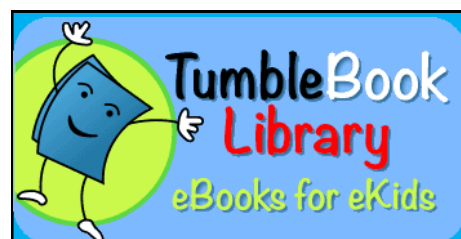
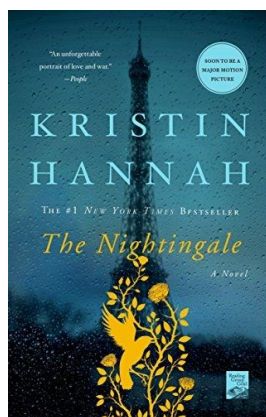
Read It B4 U C It: The Nightingale

France, 1939 - In the quiet village of Carrievau, Vianne Mauriac says goodbye to her husband, Antoine, as he heads for the Front. She doesn't believe that the Nazis will invade France ... but invade they do, in droves of marching soldiers, in caravans of trucks and tanks, in planes that fill the skies and drop bombs upon the innocent. When a German captain requisitions Vianne's home, she and her daughter must live with the enemy or lose everything. Without food or money or hope, as danger escalates all around them, she is forced to make one impossible choice after another to keep her family alive.

Vianne's sister, Isabelle, is a rebellious eighteen-year-old girl, searching for purpose with all the reckless passion of youth. While thousands of Parisians march into the unknown terrors of war, she meets G  tan, a partisan who believes the French can fight the Nazis from

within France, and she falls in love as only the young can ... completely. But when he betrays her, Isabelle joins the Resistance and never looks back, risking her life time and again to save others.

While most of us don't think of World War II as a woman's war, this story puts the women who had to do whatever it took to survive in the forefront. Before you go to theaters to see this movie starring the Fanning sisters in 2022, why not pick up the novel and find out how these sisters overcome the obstacles they face and make their marks on history.
