

TEMPORARY CURBSIDE SERVICE

Beginning Monday, May 4, 2020, the Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library will temporarily offer Curbside Service for customers. Library staff has worked diligently to develop procedures for Curbside Service that follow social distancing protocols while effectively serving Library customers.

What is Curbside Service?

Curbside Service allows customers to pick up library materials that have been placed on hold. The designated Curbside Pickup Location is at the entrance to the library. Requests will be filled by staff in the order they are received.

When can I pick up items using Curbside Service?

Curbside Service will be available **Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to Noon and 2:00 to 5:30 p.m.**

Who can use Curbside Service?

All Library cardholders in good standing and with unexpired library cards can use the service. You must have your library card number and you must have items on hold that are ready to be picked up. In accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines, the public is advised not to visit the library curbside program if they are experiencing any signs or symptoms of illness including but not limited to; shortness of breath, fever, sore throat or cough. Stay home and minimize exposure to others.

How do I use the Curbside Service?

- Place items on hold using the Library [website catalog](#). You will need your library card number and pin number (may be your last name) to sign in. Once you are logged in,

search for the book you would like to check out. Click on the title of the book and then, if it says available, click on Place Hold. Limited to 5 items per library card.

- If you do not have access to a computer, you may call 722-1255 to Place a Hold.

- It may take up to 24 hours to pull your items from the shelves. Please **DO NOT** come to the library until we call to let you know your items are ready for pickup.

- Library staff will prepare your items for pickup. Once items are ready, they will notify you. Please let the staff member know that you will be using Curbside Service, as well as the day you will be picking up the items. That will allow us to assign the correct due date.

- Go to the Library's designated Curbside Pickup at the entrance to the library.

- You will need to have your library card & valid Identification with you when you arrive to pick up your items. Be sure to bring it with you.

- When you arrive at the Library's Pickup Location, call 722-1255 and let the staff know what kind of vehicle you are driving, and be prepared to show a photo ID and your library card through the closed car window. Social distancing procedures will be strictly followed. Staff will not approach a car if the windows are rolled down.

- Remain in your vehicle until library staff has checked your ID, delivered your items to the pickup area and returned inside the library. Then you may approach and pick up your library materials.

Will I lose my HOLD items if I do not pick up during the closure?

No, if you choose not to pick up items placed on hold during the closure, you will not lose your holds; they will be waiting for you when the library opens.

How do I return library materials?

DO NOT return books to the Curbside Pickup Location. You may return your Library materials using the exterior book drops.

What safeguards are in place with regards to books being reissued?

Books picked up using Curbside Service will not have been used by another patron for at least 9 days. In order to safeguard the health of patrons and staff, the Library is quarantining all items for 9 days after their return. We are using an abundance of caution, based on research indicating that the longest persistence of the virus on surfaces is 6 to 9 days (paper 4-5 days).

Can you print something for me?

Due to the CDC's recommended social distancing policy, we are unable to provide this service.

Remember...

- You must stay in your car until it is time to retrieve your holds.
- You must show your library card and ID when we come out to your car.
- You must have received notification from us that your items are ready.
- Your library account must be unexpired and in good standing - no fines, no unpaid lost or damaged items.

Most of you know that the library has a streaming movie service available for its patrons but how many of you KNOW that most of the movies we have bought have well known actors and actresses in them? Here's just a few that we thought you might like to see.

Before they were part of Earth's Mightiest Heroes, Robert Downey Jr starred in "A Guide to Recognizing your Saints" where he plays Dito, a writer in L.A., goes home to Astoria, Queens, after a 15-year absence when his mother calls to say his father's ill. As his friends end up dead, on drugs, or in prison, he comes to believe he has been saved from their fates by various so-called saints. Jeremy Renner starred in the biopic "Dahmer" about the serial killer Jeffrey Dahmer's exploits before he was captured. Captain America's Chris Evans starred in the movie

Now that we have piqued your interest, why not sign in with your library card and check one out tonight?

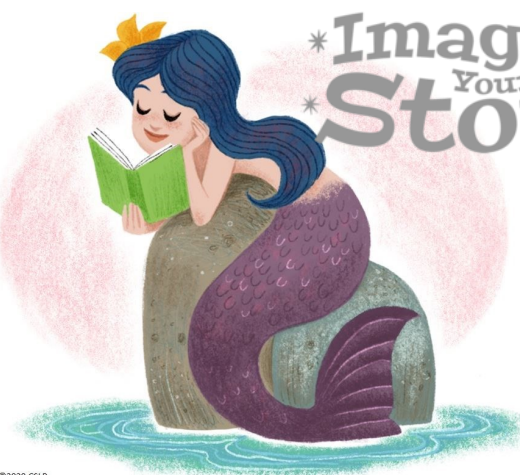

Donations: What does the library accept?

The Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library gratefully accepts donations of gently used items. Some materials may be placed into our collection to cover gaps in series or to replace our copies that have been worn or damaged to the point where they can't be enjoyed properly any longer. Other materials may be placed in the Friends of the Library book sale. Do you want to know what we need and what we don't need? Here are some helpful hints for you to use before you box up your donations to bring in:

What we NEED:

1. **Hardcover and/or paperback books, and magazines** if they are in good condition such as:
 - * Recent Bestsellers
 - * Books or magazines published in the last five years
 - * CLEAN copies of "classic" titles
 - * Large Print Books
2. **Audiovisual Materials** such as:
 - * DVDs and/or Blu Ray movies
 - * Books on CD
 - * Video Game Discs



Please check to make sure that all discs are included before you donate any of these items.

3. **Local History Materials** on Jefferson County and East Texas or West Louisiana areas such as:
 - * Maps
 - * Family Histories
 - * Church Histories
 - * Local Histories
4. **Local High School Annuals, City Directories for Beaumont and Port Arthur, etc.**

What we DON'T NEED:

1. **Materials that have a musty, smoke, or mildew odor or in really poor condition.** If the pages are yellowed, water damaged, the bindings broken, or the covers are missing, then these items can't be used.
2. **Reader's Digest Condensed books**
3. **Dated information** such as:
 - * Travel guides older than five years
 - * Textbooks older than three years
 - * Encyclopedia sets older than five years
 - * Old professional magazines such as nursing or medical journals
 - * Old news magazines such as Time or Newsweek

If in DOUBT, please ask us!



If you do decide to donate items to the library and would like a receipt for tax purposes, count the number of books and other items you are donating beforehand. We will be happy to help fill out the paperwork. We will give you signed, dated receipts for the number of items but we cannot assess the value of the items you are donating.

We thank you in advance for any items that you feel like donating to help the library.
