1000 BOOKS BLFORE KINDERGARTEN

Have you heard about the program called "1000 Books Before Kindergarten?" Have you ever wondered if you and your child could actually read 1000 books before they step into their kindergarten room for the first time? Why not try it with us? It will be a fun way to make memories with your child and your child will get prizes for each 100 books recorded in their logs.

The concept is simple, the rewards are priceless. Read a book (ANY BOOK) to your newborn, infant, toddler, and/or child. The goal is to read 1000 books before your child starts kindergarten. (YES, you can do this!) Does it sound hard? Not really if you think about it. If you read just ONE book every night, you will have read 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1095 books in three years. If you consider that most children start kindergarten at around 5 years of age, you have

more time than you think. If your child will start kindergarten next year, all you have to do is read 3 books every day and they will reach 1095 books BEFORE they go to kindergarten. Did we tell you that you can count the books your child hears at story time also? See we just made it even easier for your child to reach this goal! So let's get started!

How to Participate @ the Library

- Sign up at the front desk and pick up the log for the first 100 books.
- Read with your child. This is a wonderful bonding moment for you and your child.
- Keep track of all of the titles of the books you read to your child. Remember that you can include the books that your child hears at Story Time, book/CD kits your child hears, & ebooks such

as the ones on Tumblebook library, Overdrive, etc.

- If you can, try to keep a record of all of the books that are read to your child, even the ones by teachers, baby sitters, grandparents, and siblings.
- Once you complete 100 books, bring the list into the library for a prize.
- Pick up the log for the next 100 books. Read and repeat until you and your child have read a thousand books.

The Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library offers FREE One-on-One Tech Help by appointment, in addition to our technology workshops. So when you have more than a quick question about technology, try booking up to a 30 minute appointment for one-on-one technology help! To make an appointment for a one-on-one technology assistance session, call the library staff at (409) 722-1255. Please note that you may only book ONE appointment at a time. This is a trial program. Its continuation will depend on use and staffing issues that may arise.

Examples of what you can learn how to use:

- Kindle eReaders
- Setting up your devices to use Overdrive
- Microsoft Office Basics
- Setting up a Gmail and a Google Drive account
- Social Media such as Facebook, Twitter, etc.
- Smartphone Basics
- Downloading apps to your devices (smartphones, tablets, laptops, etc.)

You'll need to have some information to get started and there are some limits on the help we can provide.

- One-on-One appointments are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.
- Please arrive with a clear goal of what

you would like to learn and any device you need help with

- Please note that the library staff may not be able to provide detailed assistance for all products such as nonstandard software.
- Library staff can't suggest what type of software you might need for a particu-

lar issue or project you are trying to tackle if they have not already used that specific type of program before.

• Library staff cannot give advice on medical, legal or tax issues nor will they be able to

write, edit, or complete any documents for any individuals.

Brainfuse Help Now

The first day back to school after the long winter break is January 7th. Does your student need help understanding their homework? Why not let the library's newest online service help?

Brainfuse is a homework help website where students and tutors can meet in the Brainfuse Online Classroom. There tutors guide students through homework challenges and help them develop the necessary skills to complete assignments on their own. But that is just the beginning of what Brainfuse has to offer students and adults.

Brainfuse offers live skills tutoring and an extensive library of Brainfuse-created lessons and videos tutorials that can be accessed when the tutors are offline or if the student just needs a little more information on the subject. There are games and quizzes that the student could customize by just uploading the list of words or material needed to be studied and then "play" their way into remembering it all. In addition, SkillSurfer contains hundreds of practice tests in a wide range of subjects. Along with the normal subjects, SkillSurfer offers practice test for tests such as:

- The new SAT
- ACT
- The new GED
- TASC (a GED alternative test)
- HiSet (a GED alternative test)
- GRE
- GMAT
- ASVAB
- TOEFL
- TOEIC
- US Citizenship Test Course: (including practice tests and lessons)
- College Placement Test Preparation: (COMPASS/ACCUPLACER)

Once the practice test is taken, the student can see what areas of the test they need help on and either use the online lessons and videos or access a tutor for more help.

Brainfuse also has a Writing Lab where a student can upload a paper they are writing to have the tutors look over it and give them suggestions about areas of their paper, including voice, fluency, organization, and word choice.
