July is Cell Phone Courtesy Month

It's one of the greatest inventions of our time, but as the cell phone has developed into the smartphone, it's also one of the greatest distractions, too. July is National Cell Phone Courtesy Month, an event founded in 2002 with the intent of making cell phone users more respectful of their surroundings.

In honor of National Cell Phone Courtesy Month, here are the top tips to become more courteous on your smartphone:

- Put your smartphone away when having dinner with friends. Don't even look at it, ever. Put people first, technology second.

- Wait until you get home or get in your car to post pictures on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram.
- If everyone needs to know the answer to a perplexing trivia question, one person is permitted to Google. Put the phone away as soon as you have an answer.

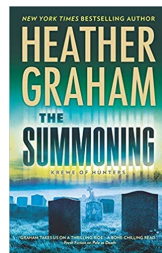
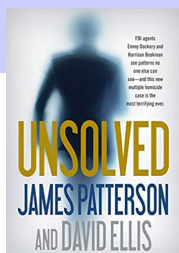

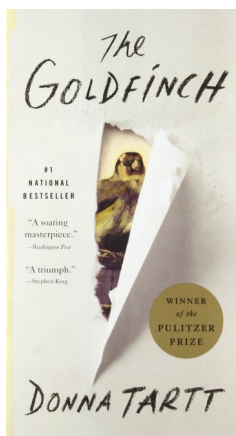

Read It B4 U C It: Goldfinch

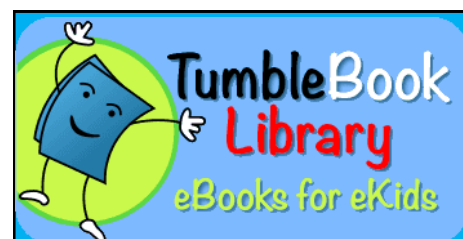


Have you ever had one moment in your life that changed everything? Have you ever done something that not only life defining but were also probably the worst decisions in your life? This is the story the "Goldfinch" tells.

Told over the course of a decade, The Goldfinch revolves around the tumultuous upbringing of a young man who, after losing his mother as a teenager due to a terrorist attack at an art museum, has to deal with a subsequent chain of increasingly unpleasant (but life-defining) events: Stealing a painting by Carel Fabritius from the museum after the bombing, moving

to Las Vegas with his alcoholic dad, and financially supporting himself thanks to the seedy underbelly of the art-forgery community. He might not know it yet, but all of these moments might be preparing him for something even bigger.

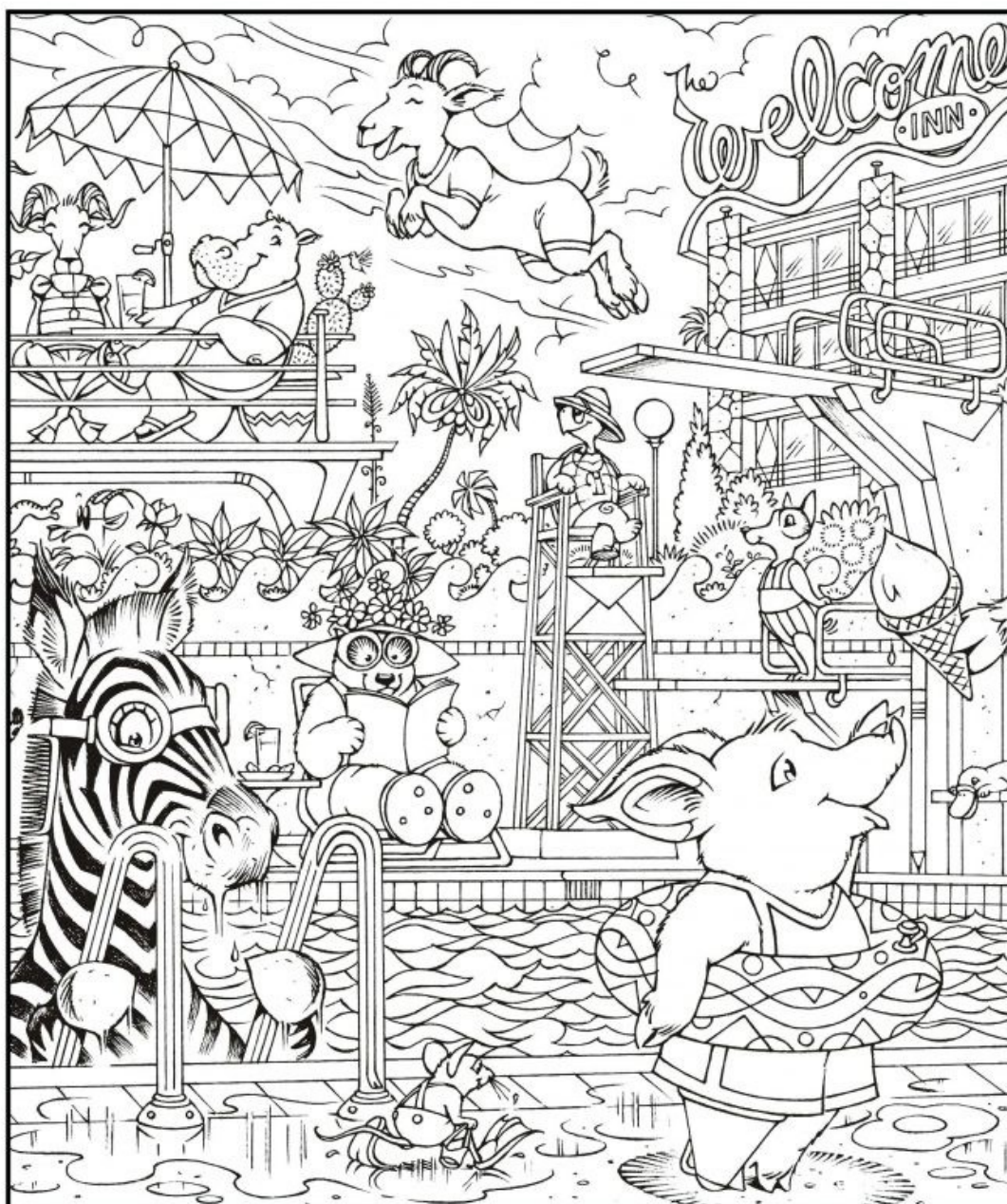

International Children's Digital Library

Have you ever tried to read a book that was not written in the language you speak? If you have not, could you imagine how hard that must be especially for a child? The Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library has put a link on the Booklists for Kids page under the Reader's Corner tab (<https://www.ned.lib.tx.us/mehpl-readers-corner-1>) to the International Children's Digital Library.



The International Children's Digital Library (ICDL) is a five year project funded primarily by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) to create a digital library of international children's books. This five-year research project, created in collaboration with the Internet Archive and conducted by the University of Maryland has five primary goals:

- To create a collection of more than

10,000 books in at least 100 languages that is freely available to children, teachers, librarians, parents, and scholars throughout the world via the Internet;

- To collaborate with children as design partners in the development of computer interface technologies that support children in searching, browsing, reading, and sharing books in electronic form;
- To better understand the concepts of rights management and "fair use" in a digital age;
- To evaluate the impact that access to digital materials may have on collection development and programming practices in school and public libraries;
- To develop a greater understanding of the relationship between children's access to a digital collection of multicultural materials and children's attitudes toward books, libraries, reading, technology, and other countries and cultures.

The materials included in the collection reflect similarities and differences in cultures, societies, interests, and lifestyles of peoples around the world. The collection's focus is on identifying materials that help children to understand the world around them and the global society in which they live.

The collection has two primary audiences. The first audience is children ages 3-13, as well as librarians, teachers, parents, and caregivers who work with children of these ages. The second audience is international scholars and researchers in the area of children's literature.

The library hopes that including this digital collection will give more children and adults access to more books in their native languages to enjoy. As of 2017, the ICDL has almost 5000 books digitized in 59 different languages for children and adults to explore. Why not do a search to see what types of books are available?
