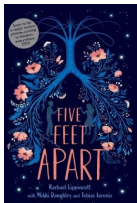

Read an eBook Day

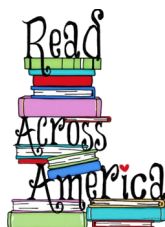


Have you ever read an eBook? Today we will read eBooks and learn all about them.

April 10

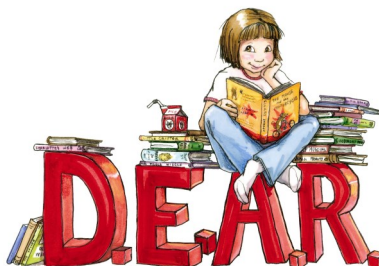
National Robots Week

Easter

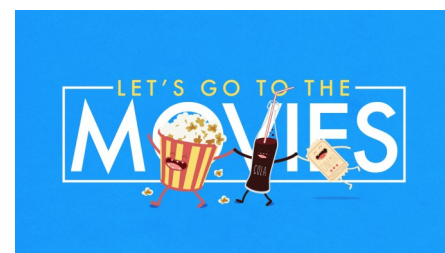
We will have another Easter Story Time for anyone who missed Wednesday's. Bring your baskets for another Easter Egg hunt in the library!

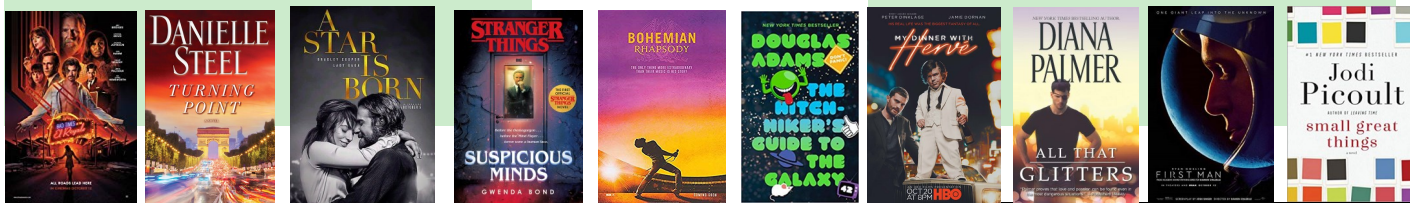

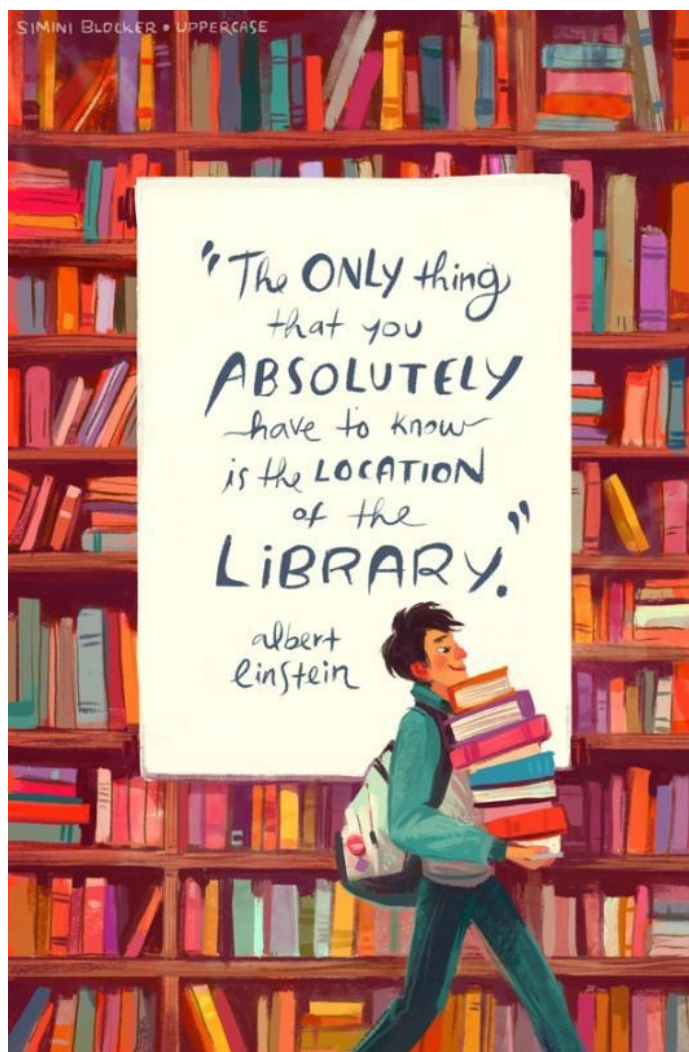
