Need help using your new Kindle? Want to create a Facebook profile but don't know where to get started? The Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library is now offering FREE One-on-One Tech Help by appointment, in addition to our technology workshops. So when you have more than a quick question about technology, try booking up to a 30 minute appointment for oneon-one technology help! To make an appointment for a oneon-one technology assistance session, call the library staff at (409) 722-1255. Please note that you may only book ONE appointment at a time. This is a trial program. Its continuation will depend on use and staffing issues that may arise.

- Kindle or Nook eReaders
- Setting up your devices to use Overdrive
- Microsoft Office Basics
- Setting up a Gmail and a Google Drive account
- Social Media such as Facebook, Twitter, etc.
- Smartphone Basics

You'll need to have some information to get started and there are some limits on the help we can provide.

One-on-One appointments are scheduled on a first come, first served basis.

- Please arrive with a clear goal of what you would like to learn and any device you need help with
- Please note that the library staff may not be able to provide detailed assistance for all products such as nonstandard software.

Library Databases

Have you ever USED our databases either at home or here in the library? They are free for patrons to use and they can make researching all kinds of topics much easier. This year we have gotten a couple of new ones that might just help you out.

A lot of people are trying to move away from all of the chemicals in medications and are looking for more "Natural & Alternative Treatments".

Natural & Alternative Treatments is a new database that contains detailed information on almost 200 different conditions and the conventional and natural treatments used to treat them, over 300 herbs and supplements, plus drug-herb and drug-supplement inter-



actions for more than 90 drug categories. The database also helps you find some functional foods that could help with alternative medications.

With people wanting to try things on Pinterest and on the DIY shows, wouldn't it be great if you had access to a "Hobbies & Crafts Reference Center?"

Hobbies & Crafts Reference Center offers "how-to" instructions for virtually every



hobby enthusiast with full text for more than 1,500 leading hobby books and craft magazines that cover Arts &

Crafts, Collecting, Home & Garden, Indoor Recreation, Kids' Crafts, Model Building, Needlecrafts & Textiles, and more.

But what about those of you who love to make home improvements by yourself to save a little money? **The Home Improvement Reference Center** database provides users with user-friendly "how-to" information covering a range of home improvement and repair projects and features full-text content from leading magazines, images not found anywhere else online, and videos of popular home repair projects.

Sometimes the car might just need to be looked at and going to the shop is going to be out of the question. Why not look up the **Small Engine Repair Reference Center** database and see what instructions they have for you to look at while you are under the hood? This database provides repair guides for small engines and routine maintenance (tune-ups, brake service, etc.) as well as extensive repairs (engine and transmission disassembly) and also allows users to search by product type, brand, model/engine type, specific area of model/engine type, and model <u>numbers</u>.
