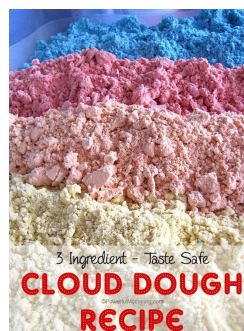

Have you planted a garden before? Come hear stories about plants that grow in people's gardens and how a garden can benefit not only the one family but the whole community.

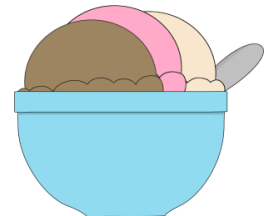

June 1 Ice Cream Party

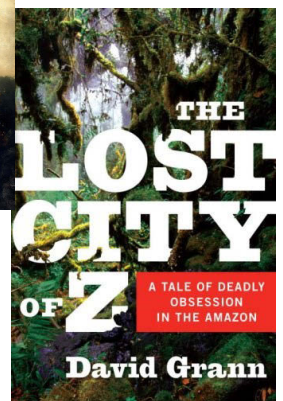
