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Don't worry! Sudoku requires no calculations or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction. It can be played by children and adults and the rules are very simple. The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow.

In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all of the digits 1 through 9 in any order.
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all of the digits 1 through 9 in any order.
- Every 3 by3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all of the digits 1 through 9 in any order.

In summary, the *SUDOKU RULE* is: Complete the sudoku puzzle so that each and every row, column, and region contains the numbers one through nine only once.

BRAINFUSE HELP NOW

Brainfuse is a homework help website were students and tutors can meet in the Brainfuse Online Classroom. There tutors guide students through homework challenges and help them develop the necessary skills to complete assignments on their own. But that is just the beginning of what Brainfuse has to offer students and adults.

Brainfuse offers live skills tutoring and an extensive library of Brainfuse-created lessons and videos tutorials that can be accessed when the tutors are offline or if the student just needs a little more infor-

mation on the subject. There are games and quizzes that the student could customize by just uploading the list of words or material needed to be studied and then "play" their way into remembering it all. In addition, SkillSurfer contains hundreds of practice tests in a wide range of subjects. Along with the normal subjects, SkillSurfer offers practice test for tests such as:

- The new SAT
- ACT
- The new GED
- TASC (a GED alternative test)
- HiSet (a GED alternative test)
- GRE
- GMAT

Once the practice test is taken, the student can see what areas of the test they need help on and either use the online lessons and videos or access a tutor for more help.

Brainfuse also has a Writing Lab where a student can upload a paper they are writing to have the tutors look over it and given them suggestions about areasof their paper, including voice, fluency, organization, and word choice.
