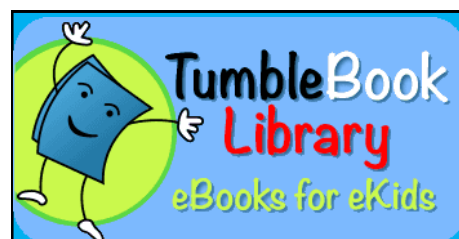
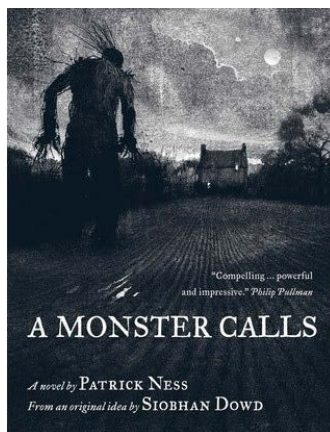


Read It B4 U C It: A Monster Calls

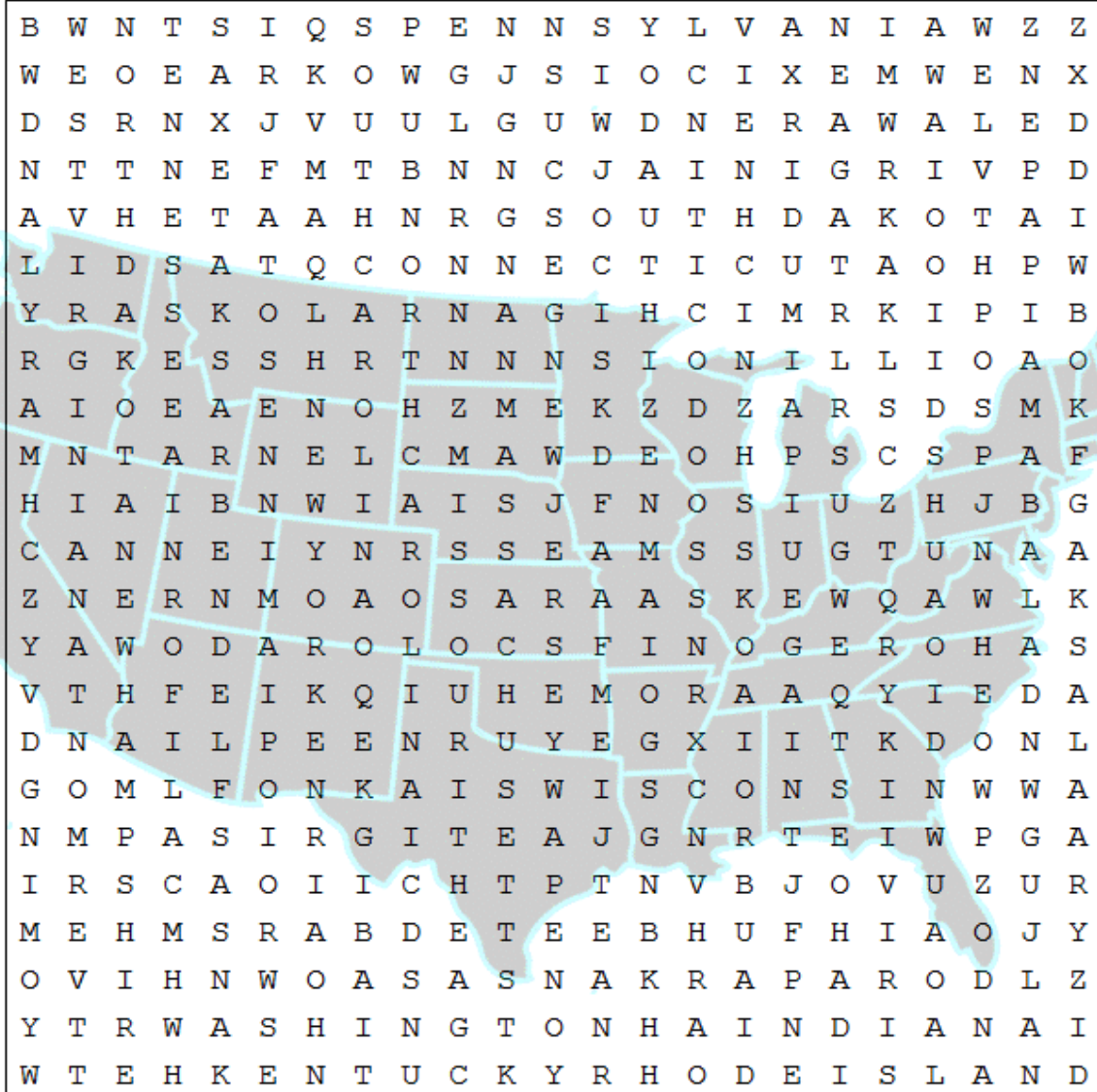

Chocolate Chip Cookies

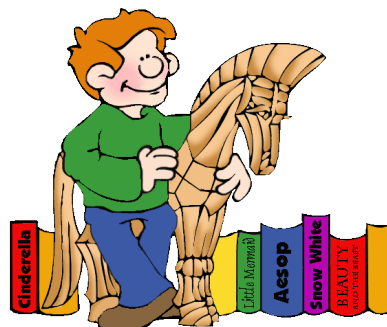
What is your favorite part of the cookie? Let me guess...the chocolate chips?? Come hear the City Manager read us some great stories all about cookies!

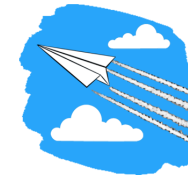
Olympics

Airplanes



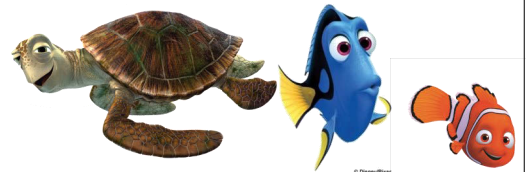
