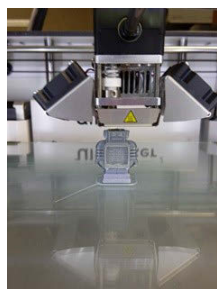

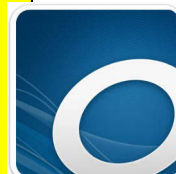

**Get Caught Reading**

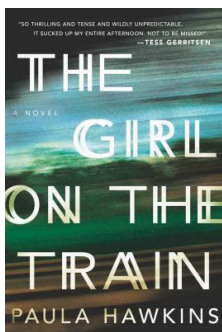

## Read It B 4 U C It: The Girl on the Train



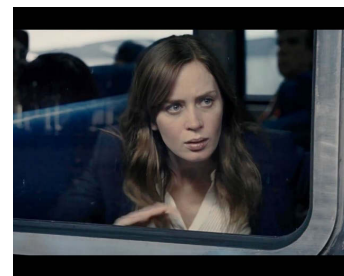
