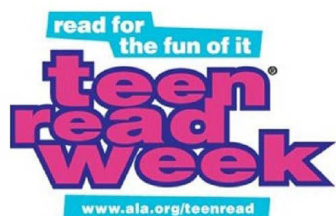

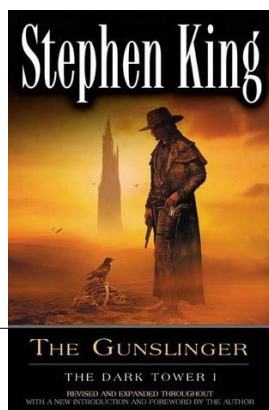
READ IT B4 U C IT — DARK TOWER

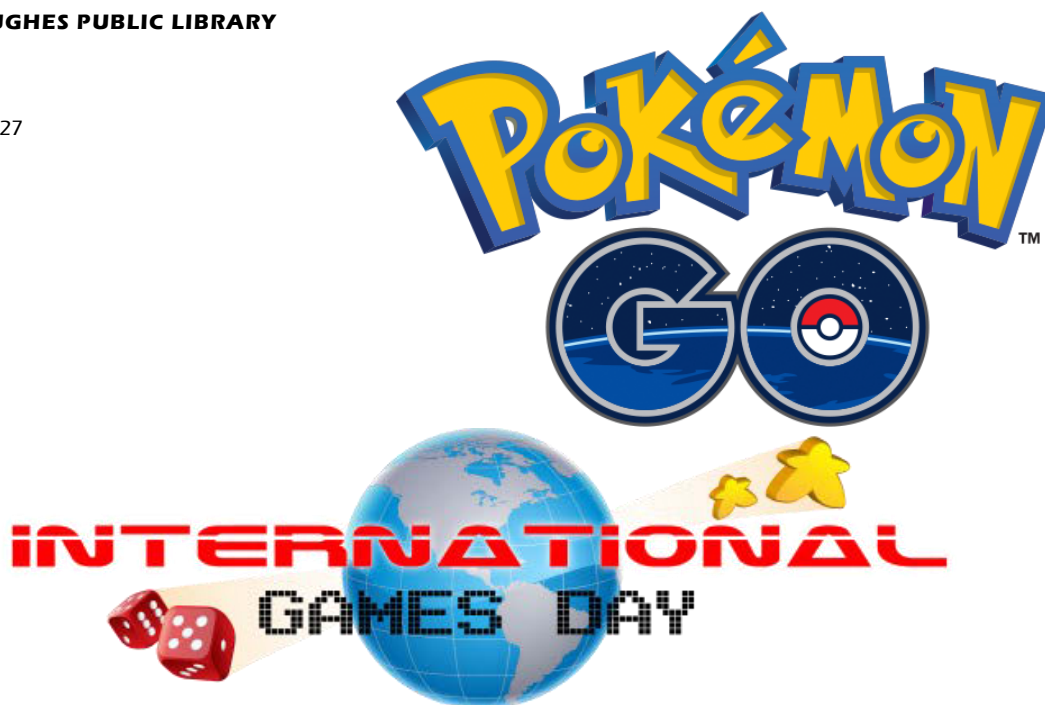
