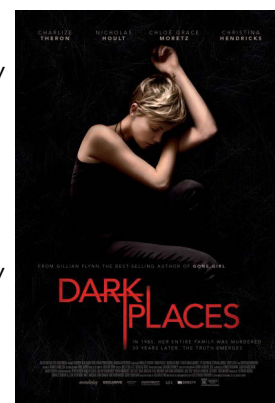
Satan Sacrifice". She survived and then testified against her teenaged brother Ben.

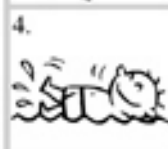
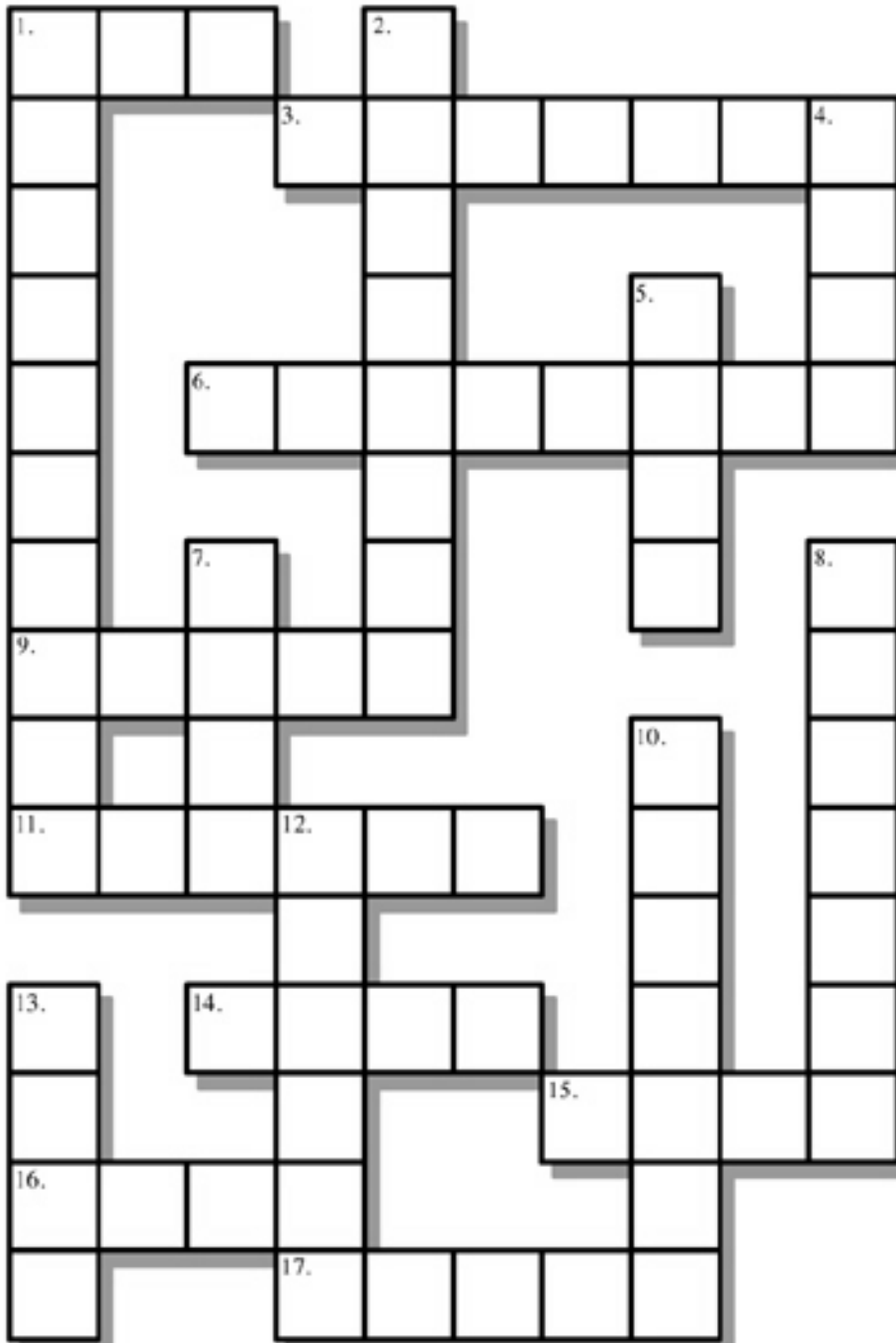


Summer Fun Picture Crossword

Clowns

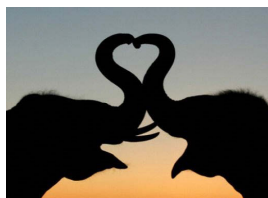
What is one of the best parts of the circus?? The funny clowns, of course! We have stories planned for you to listen to all about clowns and how they can always make us giggle!

After hearing about all of the fun we have been having this summer, our City Officials want to come and join us for even more fun. We will be having special THURSDAY storytimes at

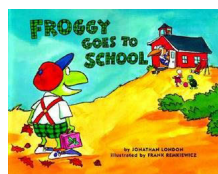
10:30 am for four more weeks this summer and we want everyone to come out and support your City Officials as they read some of their favorite stories.
