NEDERLAND VETERANS PARK

In 2015, the City of Nederland will undertake two initiatives to pay tribute to the many veterans in the community – a veterans' history project and a veterans' park. The first initiative is spearheaded by the Marion & Ed Hughes Public Library in order to honor Nederland's veterans and gather and preserve their experiences.

In Phase I of the Veterans History Project, the Library will be compiling information, photographs, copies of service records, letters, diaries and if possible a video or audio recording of our veterans from the Revolution through the present day. These will be added to an online database so people can readily access this information. It is our goal that all generations will be able to learn, understand and recognize the sacrifices made by these men and women for their country. The core of the database was formed using the names on the previous Veterans Memorials and the Nederland Honor Roll erected during WWII, but it is time to update these records.

Veterans of all conflicts and branches of service may participate as long as they have established a footprint within the City of Nederland or

graduated from Nederland High School. So whether you were born in Nederland or moved here 20 years ago, we invite you to submit a form and lend photographs or other materials. Family members may submit information for deceased veterans.

Later this year, the Nederland Parks & Recreation Department will break ground on Nederland Veterans Park, which will be built adjacent to City Hall. The Park design is being guided by a Veterans Committee, and the Park is scheduled to open on November 11, 2015 (Veterans Day).

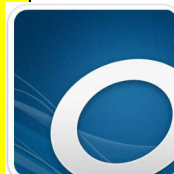

We are having an ice cream party! Come and listen to the summer stories and then eat ice cream.



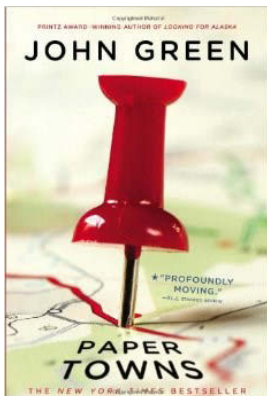

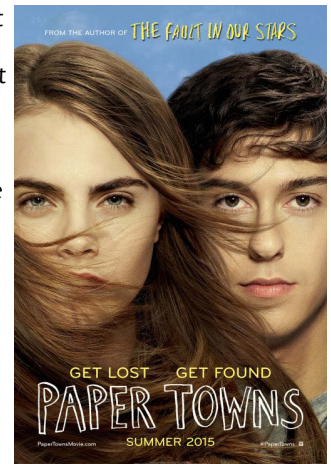


John Green's Paper Towns is a coming of age story that is centered around Quentin and his enig-

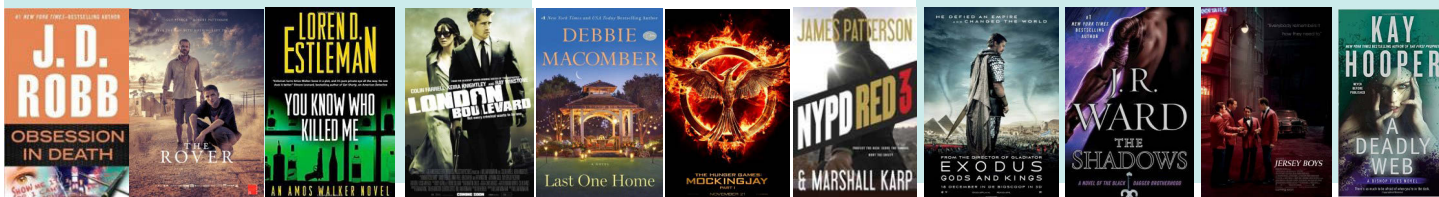

The Library offers patrons **FREE** access to a digital catalog of legal forms that can be downloaded and modified for your specific situation.

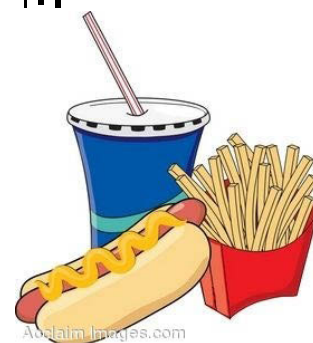

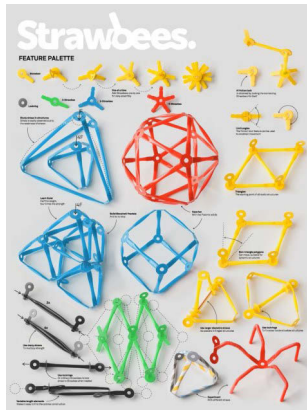

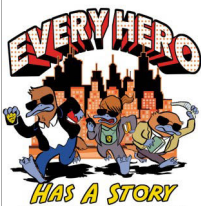


Are you ready for some fun???
