Jobview is a self-service employment application that simplifies the job search process by allowing users to find daily updated local, regional and national jobs from a simple user interface that is purpose-built for one task—search and apply for jobs! The library

provides a link to Jobview and the user can limit to any city in the United States even Nederland.

You can search and print job entries right from the website for you to look over and make sure that it is cut out for you. Did you know that you can email and even text the job entries to others who might think are better fits for the jobs you find. Just follow the directions and get that information

out to your friends. The last thing you can do right from the database is apply for the job. Just make sure you have your resume and information handy to answer any questions the application might have.

- * In 1610, tinsel was invented in Germany and it was made of real silver.
- Have you ever been to Santa Claus Lane? Every year since 1930, Hollywood Blvd is renamed Santa Claus Lane for the annual Christmas parade.
- The poinsettia is native to Mexico and was cultivated by the Aztecs, who called the plant Cuetlaxochitl ("flower which wilts"). For the Aztecs, the plant's brilliant red color symbol-

ized purity, and they often used it medicinally to reduce fever. Contrary to popular belief, the poinsettia is not poisonous, but holly berries are.

- In Poland, spiders or spider webs are common Christmas trees decorations because according to legend, a spider wove a blanket for Baby Jesus. In fact, Polish people consider spiders to be symbols of goodness and prosperity at Christmas.
- In 1962, the first Christmas postage stamp was issued in the United States.
- Santa Claus gets over a million letters mailed to him every year!
